Diane Mazy gave an update about the Club's website. The prior webmaster has been contacted and new volunteers found to take over. Dina Perugina had questions about the process, seeking to ensure that the Club does not again lose website control.

Linda Harger moved that the Club hold a February special meeting at which matters of concern raised by Dina could be discussed. The motion received several seconds and was approved by voice vote. Dale will proceed with planning. Linda expressed the hope that all would attend.

Most picnic trial entrants have switched to training rather than competing, but one award was forthcoming. George Rogers won the Open class with Blaine Hyde's dog Deke, a fitting tribute to their long friendship after Blaine's passing last year. Brett noted that a volunteer will be needed for the Saturday 3/9 picnic trial because he will be out of town.

The meeting was officially adjourned at 8:30 pm, followed by the evening's raffle of varying prizes donated by Club members.
