Aleutian Kennels, Jack Pickard Enter Boise Owned Canines

The northwest's top retrievers will swing into action this afternoon at 1 p. m. at Lake Lowell, under sponsorship of the newly formed Idaho Retriever Trial club Boise.

Chesapeake bays and black Labradors will compete for top ranking in the event, which will include both land and water exhibitions with live ducks and pigeons.

Favored to win the event is D. R. Iorns, Seattle, one of the Pacific coast's top trainers and handlers, and a member of the board of directors of the American Chesapeake club. Iorns' top dog will be Duke of Kamian, recent winner of the Vancouver B. C., trials.

A large number of Oregon and southern Idaho animals will complete the field. Jack Pickard, Boise, will enter a prize black Labrador, and local Chesapeakes may be headed by three canines from the Aleutian kennels of Boise, topped by High Test Pride of Marcroft, a three-year-old female that has won points in eastern competition.

The public is cordially invited to attend the trials, which will be held at Lake Lowell's boat landing, lower embankment. Official

Retriever Club Schedules Local Trials on Sunday

Field Dog trials will be held Sunday by the Idaho Retriever Trial club, Peter Brooks, treasurer, said today. Land trials will begin at 9 a. m. at Bradley field airport, and water trials at 2 p. m. at Julia Davis park lagoon.

A picnic will be held following the land trials. Trials have been divided into puppy stakes, for dogs under 12 months; junior stakes, for dogs under 2 years, and all-age retrievers. A special stake will be held for any dogs, other than retriever breeds, that will retrieve in water.

William Billew, Seattle, an accredited American Kennel club judge, will be here to judge the trials, Brooks said.

Trophies donated by George Walker, Dr. J. C. Lundy and W. A. Kelley will be given for the winner of each stake.

Brooks said all field dog owners were invited to bring their dogs to the trials.

Retriever Trials Planned in Spring

A trial sponsored by the Idaho Retriever Trial club and sanctioned by the American Kennel club will be held sometime this spring at a site and on a date to be announced later, Dr. John C. Lundy, club president, said Thursday.

Lundy said the club's board of directors, meeting at Nampa, had decided on the meet. He said outstanding bird dogs from throughout the west are expected to compete.

A general membership meeting will be held in Boise, March 20.
